You will receive two sets of the California EEI curriculum, enough materials to use with all the students in your classroom as well as hands-on activities to experience and take back.

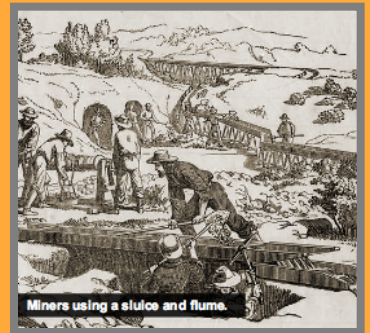
